White Gallery | 16 March - 14 July

Our celebratory exhibition about local comedian Larry Grayson returns with some new exhibits. Learn about his life in Larry's own words.

The exhibition features the letters he wrote to superfan Pauline as well as numerous images and ephemera collected by Margaret Kane. The exhibition will also feature his big red book from, 'This is Your Life' as well as many rarely seen private photographs on loan from his nephew Mike Malyon. The exhibition also includes a Dress Up Larry, bow tie interactive and colouring sheets which celebrate Larry's always dapper appearance.

This exhibition provides a taster of the rich history of Nuneaton Town Football Club. Featuring football shirts, photographs and programmes from key moments in the Club's history. This is a chance to reminisce about happier days. As usual there are activities for children.



"Endangered and Extinct" by Val Hunt

Landing Gallery \mid 22 July – 21 September 2024

This touring exhibition 'Reincarnated Rubbish – Endangered and Extinct' hopes to raises awareness and presents a subtle message of preservation and why species are dying out at an alarming rate combined with inspiring everyone to experiment with creative recycling. This exhibition encompasses Val's love of the natural world with her ingenuity and skill at recreating the creatures that are 'on the edge' or 'gone for ever' from materials that most of us discard. Exhibitions

Cusp by Anne Guest

Yellow Gallery | 26 July – 2 September 2024

This series of Cyanotype artworks show the beauty and fragility of nature at a time when we appear to be on the cusp of losing so much. The Cyanotypes are made using the ultraviolet from the sun. Anne loves that these works are made in partnership with nature, allowing chance and the weather to be partners in the process. Anne was shocked to discover that the UK is one of the most nature depleted countries in the world and she hopes her work will inspire



the viewer to see the beauty in the flora and fauna so that they are not taken for granted. Anne's work will be for sale.

Walking With Trees by Hilary Morris

Landing Gallery | 17 August – 28 September 2024

This exhibition by local artist Hilary focusses on trees, many of them local. Hilary began making the work during Covid when she couldn't access the coast where she normally finds inspiration. Initially attracted by their shape Hilary produced paintings which show the variety of species and how they change through the seasons. Hilarys' work will be for sale.



Wild Winter a Touring Exhibition from Blue Tokay

White Gallery | 28 September - 10 November 2024

This stunning exhibition brings together wildlife photography and science. It encourages visitors to think about animals which live in harsh winter environments. How have they adapted their lives to survive and even thrive in these very cold conditions.

The Picture Gallery

First Floor

This room showcases a range of paintings and sculpture from the Museum's collection. We like to encourage people to look closely at the art. What can a portrait tell us about the person's background and mood? How have different artists depicted the changing nature of the sea? What different stories can artworks reveal?



The Local History Gallery

Ground Floor

The Borough of Nuneaton and Bedworth has been a place to live and work for over 1000 years. This gallery brings to life its rich history through objects and stories. Find out about the entertainer Larry Grayson, the Royal Gurkha Rifles regiment, how Nuneaton got its name, and Nuneaton's varied industries.



The George Eliot Parlour and Writing Room

Ground Floor

George Eliot (1819-80) was a famous Victorian novelist who grew up in Griff, Nuneaton. She wrote several books including Middlemarch and Adam Bede. Our galleries include a reconstruction of her parlour where she wrote and entertained, and objects associated with her life and novels. You can find out who George Eliot was, what influenced her writings and how her fame has spread across the world.

How to find us

The Museum is in Riversley Park near Ropewalk Shopping Centre and just off Coton Road and Vicarage Street. Approximately ten minutes' walk from Nuneaton train station and three minutes' walk from the town centre. Long and short stay car parks are nearby which include disabled parking. There is free parking for up to 3 hours next to the Museum building, or a pay and display area off Coton Road (turn left at Cocks Lloyd Solicitors, postcode CV11 5TX) Bus Routes: the closest bus stop is on Coton Road.
