RECORD OF THE DECISION

a) The issue

To get BAM into contract as the supplier for the construction of Abbey Street Phase 2, following NBBC's external funding applications / finances approval and delivery as per agreed timescales with funding partners.

b) The Decision

To approve the contract with BAM for the delivery of Abbey Street Phase 2

REASON FOR THE DECISION

The Council has been successful in securing Government funding from Future High Streets Funding, Towns Fund and Levelling Up Fund. BAM Construction successfully delivered Phase 1 works and have commenced Phase 2 of the project through a legal letter of intent pending the full contract being signed. That contract has now been signed. There is a risk that Phase 2 will profile as an overspend and that further value engineering work may be required to bring it back within budget. In discussion with the Senior Officers of the Council and in consultation with the Leader , and noting that work has commenced on site, it is felt that entering a contact reduces the risk profile to the authority and therefore remains the right thing to do.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED IN MAKING THE DECISION

Do not accept the contract price provided by the BAM and look at alternative procurement processes, with the risk that the delivery of the Abbey Street project will not be completed by agreed external funders timescales and funds returned circa £26M
