PUBLIC BUSINESS

1. <u>EVACUATION PROCEDURE</u>

2. <u>PUBLIC CONSULTATION</u> - Members of the public will be given the opportunity to speak on specific agenda items if notice has been received.

Members of the public will be given three minutes to speak on a particular item and this is strictly timed. The chair will inform all public speakers that, their comments must be limited to addressing issues raised in the agenda item under consideration and, that any departure from the item will not be tolerated.

The chair may interrupt the speaker if they start discussing other matters which are not related to the item, or the speaker uses threatening or inappropriate language towards Councillors or officers and if after a warning issued by the chair, the speaker persists, they will be asked to stop speaking by the chair. The chair will advise the speaker that, having ignored the warning, the speaker's opportunity to speak to the current or other items on the agenda may not be allowed. In this eventuality, the chair has discretion to exclude the speaker from speaking further on the item under consideration or other items of the agenda.

 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST - To receive declarations of Disclosable Pecuniary and Other Interests, in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct.

Declaring interests at meetings

If there is any item of business to be discussed at the meeting in which you have a disclosable pecuniary interest or non- pecuniary interest (Other Interests), you must declare the interest appropriately at the start of the meeting or as soon as you become aware that you have an interest. Arrangements have been made for interests that are declared regularly by members to be appended to the agenda (Page 4). Any interest noted in the Schedule at the back of the agenda papers will be deemed to have been declared and will be minuted as such by the Committee Services Officer. As a general rule, there will, therefore, be no need for those Members to declare those interests as set out in the schedule.

There are, however, TWO EXCEPTIONS to the general rule:

1. When the interest amounts to a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest that is

engaged in connection with any item on the agenda and the member feels that the interest is such that they must leave the room. Prior to leaving the room, the member must inform the meeting that they are doing so, to ensure that it is recorded in the minutes.

2. Where a dispensation has been granted to vote and/or speak on an item where there is a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest, but it is not referred to in the Schedule (where for example, the dispensation was granted by the Monitoring Officer immediately prior to the meeting). The existence and nature of the dispensation needs to be recorded in the minutes and will, therefore, have to be disclosed at an appropriate time to the meeting.

Note: Following the adoption of the new Code of Conduct, Members are reminded that they should declare the existence and nature of their personal interests at the commencement of the relevant item (or as soon as the interest becomes apparent). If that interest is a Disclosable Pecuniary or a Deemed Disclosable Pecuniary Interest, the Member must withdraw from the room. Where a Member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest but has received a dispensation from Audit & Standards Committee, that Member may vote and/or speak on the matter (as the case may be) and must disclose the existence of the dispensation and any restrictions placed on it at the time the interest is declared.

Where a Member has a Deemed Disclosable Interest as defined in the Code of Conduct, the Member may address the meeting as a member of the public as set out in the Code.

Note: Council Procedure Rules require Members with Disclosable Pecuniary Interests to withdraw from the meeting unless a dispensation allows them to remain to vote and/or speak on the business giving rise to the interest.

Where a Member has a Deemed Disclosable Interest, the Council's Code of Conduct permits public speaking on the item, after which the Member is required by Council Procedure Rules to withdraw from the meeting.

Summary: To seek approval for Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd in Partnership with Nuneaton Griff FC to have a Grass Pitch Licence and Changing room Lease for use of Gala Fields, Nuneaton.

Recommendations: That approval is given to enable the Grass Pitch Licence of the football pitch and Changing Room Lease at Gala Fields, Nuneaton to be given to Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd.

Options:

- That the changes be approved to enable Nuneaton Harriers Community
 Association Ltd in partnership with Nuneaton Griff FC to take on the site
 under a Pitch Maintenance agreement.
- 2. Not approve the Pitch Maintenance agreement and NBBC continue to manage the facility through pitch bookings.

Reasons:

To continue to develop relationships with communities to enable self-management of community and sporting facilities.

Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd in Partnership with Nuneaton Griff FC having the Pitch licence and Changing Room Lease for use of this facility, will keep the pitch and recreational land in formal use, which will help reduce anti-social behaviour on the site and improve the standard of the facilities. It will also increase the opportunity for residents to access sporting facilities within the Borough.

It will enable the football club to apply for funding and support from external partners to improve the facilities and standard of the playing surface.

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To seek approval for Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd in partnership with Nuneaton Griff FC. to have a Grass Pitch Licence and Changing Rooms Lease for use of Gala Fields. Nuneaton.

2. Recommendation

2.1 That approval is given to enable the Grass Pitch Licence and Lease of the football pitch and Changing Rooms at Gala Fields, Nuneaton to be given to Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Itd in partnership with Nuneaton Griff FC.

3. Background

- 3.1 The management of pitch bookings at Gala Fields is currently managed by Everyone Active in line with a service level agreement between them and NBBC to manage Pitch Bookings on NBBC behalf.
- 3.2 The site has two 11v11 Pitches, the site has been used for recreational formal football for previous seasons.
- 3.3 Over the last 5 years the site has had the facilities maintained through the Parks and Green Space contract, pitches have been line marked and have received annual pitch maintenance.
- 3.4 The football club are keen to start training and using the facilities as a home ground from the start of the new season. Looking at introducing some of their junior teams to the site.
- 3.5 A community use agreement will be agreed between NBBC and Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd. including some key objectives to be adhered to.
- 3.6 Nuneaton Harriers Community Association Ltd. have long term visions for the site, wanting to work with Birmingham FA and Football Foundation to secure funding to improve the pitch quality, and quantity of pitches.

4. Financial Implications

4.1 NBBC will continue to support with grounds maintenance of the site.
