b) The Decision

To procure an external contractor to undertake works as and when required for the Responsive Repairs team.

REASON FOR THE DECISION

Procuring an external contractor to carry out various types of works will support the Responsive Repairs team to undertake their repair obligations, as a landlord.

This contract will also be utilised across all services within the Responsive Repairs team including voids works, which will ensure properties are ready to let more efficiently.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED IN MAKING THE DECISION

An open tender process was applied in order to achieve a good current live market comparison and pricing that had value for money. As the contract applies to small repair works and is reactive it's a great contract for local SME's.

Most frameworks only really attract large companies where the size of jobs and type of works required under this contract may not be of any interest to larger companies (which are also not local or near) which also hold increased framework rates, so higher pricing rates.

This is why an open tender was decided upon, to gain best value for money within the current market with hopefully SME's who are attracted to this type of reactive works and contract value size that are on hand to react when required.
