RECORD OF EXERCISE OF DELEGATED AUTHORITY BY OFFICER PURSUANT TO REGULATION 13 OF THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES (EXECUTIVE ARRANGEMENTS) (MEETINGS AND ACCESS TO INFORMATION) (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2012 & THE OPENNESS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT BODIES REGULATIONS 2014

SUBJECT OF DECISION

To engage a supplier to carry out a Waste Composition Analysis sampling exercise to enable the Council to understand and assess its options regarding the future design and delivery of a separate weekly food waste collection service.

REASON FOR THE DECISION

By April 2026 the Council is required to start to collect food waste on weekly basis from households in Borough. The Waste Composition Analysis will allow the Council to determine the composition of residual waste bins sampled across the Borough, specifically the amount of food waste being thrown away.

The sampling will be taken from 250 properties across the whole authority area over a 5 day period. While the properties will be randomly chosen, those included will have different Output Area Classifications (OAC).

The Output Area Classification (OAC) filters key results from the National Census for the entire UK to indicate the character of local areas. It profiles populations and other data to produce a socio-demographic break down of households into 8 distinct profiles. This level of sampling will ensure that the results are representative of the communities within the Borough and will enable the Authority to make detailed plans on the resources it will need to deliver the service.

No personnel data will be collected, individual properties and individuals will not be identifiable from the sampling. Once the waste is segregated it will go for disposal as all the other Council's general waste.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED IN MAKING THE DECISION

This requirement has no alternate options as the information can only be sourced via such an exercise and is bespoke to the Borough.

WARD RELEVANCE

The exercise will include samples of waste arisings from a number of various propertytypes across the borough, not every property or ward will be involved.

FINANCIAL AND BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The funding will come from the Waste Services existing Service Transformation Budget.
